




Community Life "Happenings"

Community Life program participants visited both the Old Town and Glenburn fire houses to learn about fire safety and the jobs performed by those who work there.



PVI participants showcased their skills in the snow during Special Olympics and placed in the top three for every event they registered for!








PVI Participants rooted for their favorite high school teams during the 2025 Eastern Maine High School Basketball Tourney.
